## **Parliamentary Procedure**

Purpose of parliamentary procedure is to promote:

- Order
- Equal Opportunity
- Justice
- Right of the MINORITY to be HEARD
- Right of the MAJORITY to DECIDE

## **Making Motions**

Motions are made for a PTA to take action for plans, programs and activities. They are introduced, seconded, discussed and voted on by members at a meeting.

To legally participate in the process, an individual must have been a member of the unit for at least 30 days.

Making a motion involves 8 basic steps:

<b>Eight Steps to a Motion</b>	
Member waits to OBTAIN THE FLOOR (stand or raise hand)	
CHAIR RECOGNIZES the Member	
Member Presents the MOTION, stating:	"I move…"
MOTION SECONDED	"Is there a second?"
(second shows more than one person is interested in discussing the item)	
Chair RESTATES MOTION	"It's been moved and seconded to"
Chair Asks for DISCUSSION	"Is there any discussion?"
Motion can be amended	
Chair Calls for a VOTE	All those in favor say aye. Any opposed?
Chair Announces RESULT	Motion carried/approved or denied
